UPS was founded in Seattle, WA in 1907 and is headquartered in Atlanta, GA. UPS has more than 350,000 employees in the US and more than 434,000 globally and did \$61 billion dollars in revenue in 2016. They have an on online tracking rate of 101.3 million tracking requests per day and their global package operation deliveries 19.1 million packages and documents daily! UPS owns 239 of its own fleet of aircraft and leases 297 planes both domestically and internationally operating out of six major hubs in the US.

**Basics of Supply Chain Management** - The basic concepts in managing the complete flow of materials in a supply chain from suppliers to customers are covered in the Basics module. Supply chain concepts are introduced and basic terminology emphasized, as are relationships among activities in the supply chain. Knowledge of the material in this module is assumed as a prerequisite for the other APICS CPIM modules, which cover similar topics but in a much greater depth.

Cost for CPIM I is \$2000 for APICS members and \$2220 for non-members.
